

WHAT IS A MODIFIED STABLEFORD EVENT?

This Par 3 Championship will feature one of the more unique golf tournaments of the year. It will be a 2 Man Modified Stableford Tournament.

The most unique feature of this particular tournament is the scoring system. Unlike traditional stroke play tournaments, the Par 3 Championship will use the **Modified Stableford System**. We understand some golfers may not have heard of this way of scoring golf.

WHAT IS THE MODIFIED STABLEFORD?

The Modified Stableford system allocates points based on the number of strokes taken at each hole, with the goal of achieving the highest overall score.

The Stableford system was developed by Frank Stableford as a means of keeping tournaments competitive even if a golfer had a couple of blow-up holes. Under normal stroke play rules, if a golfer take a 12 on a hole, it's pretty likely they're out of contention for good. Under the Stableford system, however, the damage done to the overall score is significantly less.

In our Par 3 Championship the team's lowest score on a hole is utilized to determine their Stableford score for the hole and will reward points accordingly:

- +5 for an Eagle
- +2 for a birdie
- 0 for a par
- -1 for a Bogey
- -3 for a Double Bogey or worse

No matter how bad you play a particular hole, you can **only** lose 3 points.
